The Nursery Academy is open to Nursery School and Primary 1, regardless of religion, race or ability. 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Nursery Academy Information

Who is it for?

The 2024 Nursery Academy is for children born between 02/07/2018 and 01/07/2020. The Academy will be split into two distinct groups based on when your child was born. For 2023, the name of each group and associated 'born on date' bands are as follows:

Group	Date of Birth Band
Nursery School	02/07/2019 - 01/07/2020
Primary 1	02/07/2018 - 01/07/2019

If your child was born outside of these dates and you are keen to give them an introduction to Gaelic Games please contact the Nursery Academy Co-Ordinator for further information.

When does it take Place?

The Nursery Academy takes place on Saturday mornings commencing on 6th April 2024 and finishing at the end of September/start of October. Please note that sessions typically do not run over Easter (if applicable) and the July holiday period (for one week). Further updates on the Nursery Academy programme will be communicated to Parents/Guardians throughout the year.

What Your Child Will Learn

The sessions for each age group have been developed by experienced coaches within our club with an emphasis on fun. Each week, the sessions will be tweaked slightly to maintain interest of the children and coaches helping out.

As a GAA Academy, the children will get to take part in learning the skills of all GAA codes along with developing their overall physical development by:

- Providing the opportunity to be coached in boys and girls football, hurling and camogie;
- Participating in exercises that will develop their ABC's (Agility, Balance and Co-ordination) as well as basic running, jumping, catching, kicking and throwing etc. (The children need to be able to participate in games independently)



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Nursery Academy Structure and Working Group Contact Details

In previous years, the Nursery Academy was typically run by 1-2 volunteers, with the assistance of parents/guardians as coaches during sessions. However, the growing popularity of our Nursery Academy, (which frequently sees >100 children attend each morning) coupled with the administration requirements to run the Academy safely, led to a redesign of how we do things. Our philosophy is to grow the Nursery Academy sustainably by ensuring that the workload is borne by the many, rather than the few.

The 2024 Nursery Academy structure is as follows:



Further personnel will be added to the above list when volunteers come forward.

Head coaches are responsible for sourcing volunteers to help as coaches for each age group, assist with the pitch/stations setup, act as timekeepers and provide First Aid etc. We would be delighted if you could volunteer and help contribute.

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Helping Out

Volunteers are the lifeblood of Carryduff GAC and the GAA. Our Coaches, players and all members give up their time willingly to help develop Gaelic games in Carryduff. Your help as a Parent/Guardian is essential for the successful running of the Nursery Academy.

The Nursery Academy is run solely by the Parents/Guardians of the children across the 2 age groups. We not only need assistance with coaching but also a number of other roles such as: pitch set up; managing training equipment; lost children; first aid; role taking; time keeping and many more. Please make yourself known to one of the Working Group members and ask if you can assist in any way.

As reflects society itself, the GAA has now an increased bureaucratic burden and in essence this means the following are required to coach within the GAA environment:

- 1. A member of Carryduff GAC
- 2. Safeguarding Course
- 3. Access NI Vetting Clearance
- 4. Introduction to Coaching Gaelic Games

We know this places time and extra financial burden on parents but we are bound by the GAA regulations and in fairness the spirit of these is to ensure a safe and enjoyable environment for our kids.

As a club we will support you in any way we can to fulfil the criteria. Please don't be put off as coaching is a massively rewarding endeavour. You would be welcomed with open arms into Carryduff GAC.

If we are short of volunteers for a session, we will have to limit the number of participants involved or not be able to run the session and this is something we do not want to see happening.

<u>Please be aware that absolutely no experience is required to help out!</u> You do not need to have had a GAA background or have played Gaelic games before. The more Parents/Guardians that help out the more enjoyable the



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sessions are for everyone involved. Please remember that the ethos of the Nursery Academy is FUN!

Membership

Due to insurance requirements, the club must impose a 'No Pay No Play' policy. This means that annual membership for your child must be paid before they can partake in any sessions. Annual membership for the Nursery Academy is £80.00/child. This equates to less than £4.00/session as we typically hold 20+ sessions per year. Your child will also have access to hurling/camogie training every Sunday morning as well as numerous blitzes and games throughout the year. Annual family membership is also available.

Communication

Due to GDPR regulations, we use the App 'Heja' for communication. Please download the app from the website https://heja.io or search for 'Heja' in your applicable App Store. Please see Appendix A for joining instructions. The passcode for the 2024 Nursery Academy group is JT-423342.

Cancellations

As the Nursery Academy is held outdoors, we are at the mercy of the weather which can change quite quickly at our grounds mainly due to its elevation and exposure. In the past, this has resulted in occasional cancellations. We aim to give parents and coaches as much notice as possible which will be via the Heja App.

Some sessions will also need to be cancelled part way through due to inclement weather. It is vital that parents/guardians stay close by to their children throughout the sessions and must not leave the venue. This is also important as your child may need the toilet, get injured or just want you to see how great they are doing!

Medical Conditions/Allergies

If your child has any medical conditions/allergies or additional needs that could impact on their participation or enjoyment of the Nursery Academy, please indicate this in the registration form on Foireann and speak directly to the coach prior to the session.



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Please note with a number of food allergies noted we would ask as much as possible for no food to be on the pitch on the morning.

First Aid

During the registration process, we will ask you to indicate if you have first aid training or come from a medical background i.e. are a doctor/nurse etc. We will require first aid assistance during each session so please make it known if you have this expertise both during the registration process and at the beginning of each session. We will require you to have Access NI registration and Safeguarding Certification in order for us to follow the guidelines laid down by the GAA

Parental/Guardian Attendance & Involvement

We require parents/ guardians to stay for the duration of the session as at this age group kids are certainly more confident and more engaged in large part when they know you are there. Please note non-coaching parents are to remain on the outside perimeter and are not permitted on the field.

There is a strong social aspect to the Nursery Academy and coffee in abundance at the hub but if you grab one, we would ask you to bring it to the perimeter of the field where you can watch your child at play and also be there for any needs of your child including toileting.

Toileting - There are toilets open within the Club House beside the training area if required but we would ask that children go to the toilet prior to arriving at the pitch. If your child wishes to go to the toilet when at the session, we will ask you to come forward to bring them to it.

Collection at end of the session – Children will only be handed over by the coaches to their parent/guardian at the end of the session. In order to do this in a controlled manner, the children will be brought over in smaller groups so we ask you to wait until your child's group is brought forward.

Photography

Throughout the Nursery Academy, we hope to take photographs of the children to highlight their activities to the rest of the Club and also allow the children to see themselves at play. Please note that the statement on Foireann to be answered Yes/No to is "I am aware that my child's photograph or video image may be taken whilst attending tor participating in games or activities connected with the club and I consent to it being used by the Club for items like match programmes, year books, match reports, event reports or on the Club website or social media channels". Please respect the fact that some parents may not wish to have their child photographed and so we would ask



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you to be mindful that any photographs taken by you personally should not be shared on social media as permission may not be given for a child to be photographed. We will endeavour to only photograph children whose parents/guardians have given us permission to do so. If they do appear in group photographs or in the background, we will endeavour to conceal their faces.

Additional Hurling/Camogie Training

There are additional dedicated hurling/camogie sessions for children who are members of the Nursery Academy. These take place every Sunday morning (including outside of the Nursery Academy Programme) from 09:30 – 10:30.

Training takes place within the 4G pitch at Carryduff GAC. All children in Pre-School and Primary 1 are welcome and hurling sticks and helmets can be initially rented. Parents are also strongly encouraged to help out. To find out more about hurling/camogie training please contact the Hurling/Camogie Nursery Head Coach Donal Rooney via the Heja App.

Additional Football Training

Depending on interest and availability of coaches, there may be dedicated football sessions for Primary 1 members of the Nursery Academy in October and November. The format/day/time of these sessions will be confirmed later in the year.

Clothing and Equipment

All children should bring a reusable water bottle which must be labelled with their name to each session. Please ensure that during hot summer months, sun cream has been applied to your child prior to arriving for training.

Pre-School and Primary 1 sessions will normally take place on the grass pitch and as such children should wear appropriate footwear.

The Club grounds occupy an elevated site and can be cold and very windy on an otherwise pleasant morning. Please make sure that children and adults have appropriate layers of clothing with them. We recommend always having a waterproof jacket with you. Please ensure that all items of clothing have names on them.

Children's club branded jerseys and shorts are available from the O'Neills shop at the Kennedy Centre (Falls Rd) or via their website. The club also runs an





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O'Neills order a number of times throughout the year for more specific items such as tracksuits and hats etc. Details on the next order run will be communicated to parents/guardians when dates have been agreed. There is no requirement for Nursery Academy participants to purchase or wear club branded gear.

Mentor/Coaching Courses Available

Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to undertake a foundation level (ITCGG) GAA coaching course which is provided by Ulster GAA. This is a very rewarding course and will help give you additional confidence when coaching the children. Please contact Orla Napier (orlanapier@yahoo.co.uk) who will provide further information.

There will also be a 'Coaching for Coaches' session held within the club grounds before the commencement of the Nursery Academy. The date and time for this session will be forwarded in due course. This is an opportunity for all parents to see demonstrations of the activities their children will be undertaking and for coaches to get an introduction to each other and how the sessions will be undertaken. This session has proved extremely popular with parents in the past.

Child Protection Course/Access NI

Any parents willing to help out with coaching must be vetted via Access NI and have undertaken a Child Protection Course. Please contact Hilary White (07557209930) who will provide further information on the Child Protection Course. Appendix B

Access NI Registration Guide



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A simple guide to completing Access NI checks

Any adult assisting in any role with the mentoring or coaching of underage teams at Carryduff GAC should have completed an Access NI check in advance of taking up the role.

Existing coaches who have not completed an Access NI check within the last 2.5 years (i.e. before October 2021) should complete the process again in line with club policy.

All coaches and mentors should be fully paid members of the club

Information regarding Access NI checks can be accessed via Ulster GAA website http://ulster.gaa.ie/safeguarding/access-ni/

- 1. Go to https://www.nidirect.gov.uk/services/apply-online-enhanced-check-through-registered-body to set up an account and complete the online element (Ulster GAA PIN is 540101).
- 2. At the end of the process make a note of your 10 digit Access NI reference number.
- 3. Complete the cover PIN notification and ID form (see Ulster GAA link above).
- 4. Scan the completed form and necessary ID documents (listed on page 4 of PIN notification and ID form).
- 5. Send all scanned documents by email to (childrensofficer.carryduff.down@gaa.ie) who will verify your application and forward to Ulster GAA for processing.
- 6. You will receive your certificate within 4 weeks of application.

Please Note

- You must complete your application within one month of the date you applied online via NI Direct.
- Only scanned applications will be accepted this year.
