Our Carryduff girls started their campaign off with a convincing win against Rostrevor but were disappointed to then suffer tough defeats against Bredagh and Teconnaught. However, in a mark of their resilience, the girls went on to achieve further successes in their remaining group games to secure a semi-final place and a second chance at Bredagh, where, in a hard-fought match, they enjoyed a narrow victory.

The semi-final win led the girls to a final against Teconnaught - the only other team to defeat them during the tournament. This proved to be a very tight affair with both teams level on 1-3 to 1-3 at the final whistle. Following a tremendous effort in extra time, Carryduff finally came away with an amazing team win of 3-3 to 1-3.

This is the second consecutive Féile success for the majority of the squad and – with the addition of the younger girls – we know that they will be formidable opponents as they go on to represent County Down at the National Féile.

For some this will have been their last Féile while others may get further opportunities to compete with the benefit of this year's experience behind them.

We were delighted that, despite their own disappointment our County representatives, John McGeough and James Guinness, made time to greet our All Stars, contributing to a very special occasion.













One Club – transitioning to integration

What is a One Club?

'One Club' is the approach the GAA uses to describe clubs that integrate a number of codes (or different Gaelic sports) under a single club structure, with shared governance and administration arrangements and shared facilities.

Question		Answer
	What's the benefit on a One Club approach?	Essentially it is a more efficient and effective way of running the organisation and is particularly useful where space and resources are finite, but also where players play more than one code and need support to avoid burnout and align training and games. Even in a club of our size we can accommodate the needs of most teams by sharing our pitches and by everyone being open to compromise. There are significant costs associated with land purchase and pitch maintenance and it makes much more economic sense to do this collectively. It also cuts down on additional bureaucracy and makes life easier for parents where children all attend the same venue regardless of the sport they play. Above all perhaps, a single club like ours offers a much stronger sense of community when everyone feels they have a place in it.
	What 'codes' do we play?	Carryduff GAC operates 5 Gaelic games competitively: - Male Football, Ladies Football, Hurling, Camogie and Handball and offers Rounders as a social code.
	Is this linked to the GAA's plans to integrate with the Camogie Association and the LGFA by 2027?	Yes, it will certainly be an easier transition for clubs that are already integrated as they will be ahead of the curve. It is probably fair to see the One Club Model as a microcosm of what is planned nationally. Ultimately both models are about streamlining to unify governance and administrative arrangements, share resources, drive equality of representation and promote inclusion. There will be many practical challenges ahead and potentially some resistance where some codes feel they have more to lose than gain but Carryduff GAC is already well prepared and we look forward to the benefits that full integration will bring.


